### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in the tributaries to Pattee's pond, and in a portion of Wilson brook, a tributary to the outlet of said pond, in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish 2 at any time in any of the tributaries to Pattee's pond, which 3 pond is situated in the town of Winslow, County of Ken-4 nebec, or in Wilson brook, so-called, from the Abbott road, 5 so-called, to the junction of said brook with the outlet stream 6 of said Pattee's pond.

Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to take suckers 8 with spears during April and May of each year in the above-9 named waters.

No person shall have in possession any kind of fish taken II in violation of any provision of this section.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall pay 13 a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dol14 lars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this section.
