STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter sixty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section one of Chapter ninety-eight of the Public Laws of 1909, relating to the duties of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section one of chapter sixty of the revised statutes, as
a amended by section one of chapter ninety-eight of the public
3 laws of 1909, is hereby amended by striking out the word
4 "three" in the twenty-third line of said section and substi-5 tuting in place thereof the word 'four,' so that said section
6 as amended shall read as follows:

HOUSE-No. 137.

'Section I. A state department of agriculture shall be 8 maintained for the improvement of agriculture and the ad-9 vancement of the interests of husbandry. A commissioner 10 of agriculture shall be elected biennially by the legislature by II joint ballot of the senators and representatives in conven-12 tion, and shall hold his office for the term of two years and 13 until his successor is elected and qualified. He shall give 14 bond in the sum of ten thousand dollars to the state, with 15 sufficient sureties, to be approved by the treasurer of state, 16 conditioned to faithfully account for all moneys received and 17 disbursed by him as said commissioner. He shall by per-18 sonal observation, investigation and correspondence, acquaint 19 himself with the methods and wants of practical husbandry, 20 the means of fertilization, and the adaptation of various 21 products to the soils and climate of Maine; also with the 22 progress of scientific and practical agriculture elsewhere, 23 with a view to the more complete development of the natural 24 resources of the state. The commissioner of agriculture 25 shall gather statistics of information concerning agriculture 26 and publish the same annually; he shall assist the farmers 27 of the state, in so far as is practical, to secure farm help, 28 and to promote increased production of farm crops through 29 the selection, the growing and the dissemination of superior 30 strains of seeds. An appropriation of four thousand dollars 31 annually shall be made, to be expended by the commissioner 32 of agriculture for the purpose of carrying out the provisions 33 of this section and section five of chapter sixty of the re34 vised statutes, and for such other purposes and in such man-35 ner as in his judgment will best promote the interests of 36 agriculture in this state.'
