STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to further amend Section Sixty-two of Chapter Fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter fortyeight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, and by Chapter eighty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and eleven.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section sixty-two of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes
2 as amended by chapter forty-eight of the public laws of
3 nineteen hundred and five, and by chapter eighty-eight of the
4 public laws of nineteen hundred and eleven, is hereby fur5 ther amended by striking out the words "ten thousand" in
6 the thirteenth and fourteenth lines of said section as last

7 amended, and substituting in place thereof the words 'twen-8 ty-five thousand,' so that said section as amended shall read 9 as follows:

'Sect. 62. Any town which does not maintain a free high 11 school of standard grade may, from year to year, authorize 12 its superintending school committee to contract with and pay 13 the superintending school committee of any adjoining town 14 or the trustees of any academy located within such town or 15 in an adjoining town, for the tuition of scholars within said 16 town in the studies contemplated by the seven preceding 17 sections. When such contract has been made with the trus-18 tees of an academy a joint committee for the selection of 19 teachers and the arrangement for the course of study in 20 such academy shall include the superintending school committees of the contracting towns with an equal number of 2I22 the members of the board of trustees of such academy when 23 such academy has less than twenty-five thousand dollars 24 endowment. The expenditure of any town for tuition as 25 provided in this section shall be subject to the same condi-26 tions and shall entitle such town to the same state aid as if it 27 had made such expenditure for a free high school."
