STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section 1 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes of Maine, relating to nuisances.

Be it enacted by the Pcople of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I of chapter 22 of the revised statutes of the State 2 of Maine is hereby amended by striking out at the end of the

- 3 first line thereof the word "or," and at the beginning of the
- 4 second line thereof the word "keeping," and in the fourth
- 5 line thereof the word "kept" and in the fifth line thereof
- 6 the words "given away, drank or dispensed," so that said
- 7 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. All places used as houses of ill-fame, or for 9 the illegal sale of intoxicating liquors, or resorted to for

10 lewdness or gambling; all houses, shops or places where in11 toxicating liquors are sold for tippling purposes, and all
12 places of resort where intoxicating liquors are sold in any
13 manner not provided for by law are common nuisances.
14 The Supreme Judicial Court shall have jurisdiction in
15 equity, upon information filed by the county attorney or
16 upon petition of not less than twenty legal voters of such
17 town or city, setting forth any of the facts contained herein,
18 to restrain, enjoin or abate the same, and an injunction for
19 such purpose may be issued by said court or any justice
20 thereof.'
