STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Bryant Libby of Kennebunk.

Resolved, That there be paid to Bryant Libby of Kenne-
2 bunk a pension of eight dollars per month, beginning Jan-
3 uary one, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and con-
4 tinuing during the pleasure of the Legislature and until
5 otherwise ordered.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Bryant Libby enlisted on the eighteenth day of December, 1866, in Co. E 8th Reg. U. S. Army, to serve three years and was discharged from service of the U. S. on the 25th day of May, 1869, by reason of disability. He is now unable to labor and is confined to the house. He is supported by his wife's earnings by doing washing and other work. Neither he nor his wife have any property. He has never received a pension from the U. S. nor from the State of Maine. The Maine Pension Department has ruled that he is not entitled to pension under the general law.
