STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of John S. Gaddis of Kennebunk.

Resolved, That there be paid to John S. Gaddis of Kenne-
2 bunk a pension of eight dollars per month, beginning Jan-
3 uary one, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and con-
4 tinuing during the pleasure of the Legislature and until
5 otherwise ordered.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John S. Gaddis enlisted June 16, 1862, in 35th Mass. at Newburyport. He was discharged June 29, 1865. When he enlisted he was eighteen years old. His parents were then living in Massachusetts. While he was in the service his parents moved to Kennebunk. As soon as discharged the soldier came to Kennebunk, where he has always resided.

He is destitute, wholly unable to labor. He has no means of support excepting a U. S. pension of \$12 per month. He has never received state aid. The general law does not apply to this case.
