STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to Chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Otter pond, in the town of Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of 2 fish at any time in Otter pond, so called, in the town of 3 Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland, for a period of

4 five years from the time this act takes effect.

During the same period no person shall have in posses-6 sion any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision 7 of this section. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall pay 9 a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty 10 dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto 11 one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in 12 possession in violation of any provision of this section.
