STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to Chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Island pond and its tributaries, in the towns of Harrison and Waterford, in the counties of Cumberland and Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of
2 fish at any time in Island pond, so called, or in any of the
3 tributaries to said pond, which waters are situated in the
4 town of Harrison, in the county of Cumberland, and in
5 the town of Waterford, in the county of Oxford.

No person shall have in possession at any time any kind
7 of fish taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall pay
9 a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty
10 dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto
11 one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in
12 possession in violation of any provision of this section.
