STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE. for the building of a bridge across Kenduskeag
Stream in the town of Corinth, Penobscot County.

Resolved. That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the purpose of
3 building a bridge across Kenduskeag Stream in the town of
4 Corinth, Penobscot county, provided that there be appro-
5 priated by the town of Corinth or otherwise, the sum of
6 five hundred dollars (\$500) for the same purpose; provided
7 also that any additional cost above one thousand dollars shall
8 be borne by the town of Corinth. All appropriations to
9 be expended under the supervision of the State Highway
10 Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In support of resolve asking for aid in building of a bridge across Kenduskeag Stream in the town of Corinth, Penobscot county: Said Kenduskeag stream runs through said town of Corinth on the westerly side. It calls for three expensive bridges. There is one covered bridge and one iron bridge now built, at a cost of over six thousand dollars. Also one across Crooked Brook at a cost of thirty-five hundred dollars. The remaining bridge across Kenduskeag Stream must be built now.
