*Resolved, That there be paid to Mary E. Elwell a state  
2 pension of ten dollars per month from January 1st, 1915.*



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mary E. Elwell is the daughter of Eleazer C. Elwell, who was a private in Company D, Twelfth Regiment, and E, Eleventh Maine Infantry Volunteers.

The father died in the insane asylum at Augusta, Maine, and left property sufficient for the care of his widow with a small remainder to his son, and the above named daughter, Mary E. Elwell.

Mary E. Elwell was never strong minded and is now a woman nearly sixty years of age, and with but three or four hundred dollars for her support. None of her family are able to assist her and unless she receives a state pension will become a town charge. As her age increases, her mental vigor decreases.
