STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter 130 of the Public Laws of 1913.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eight of chapter 130 of the public laws of 1913 is 2 hereby amended by striking out all of the remaining portion 3 of said section after the word "counties" in the thirteenth 4 line of said section, so that said section as amended shall 5 read as follows:

Sect. 8. The commission shall lay out, construct and 7 maintain a system of state and state aid highways substan-8 tially as herein described, and the expense of constructing 9 such state highways shall be borne wholly by the state, ex-10 cept as otherwise provided in section twenty-three. The

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11 commission shall be sole arbiter of the designation of the 12 state and state aid highways, but shall after reasonable no-13 tice by publication give all parties interested an opportunity 14 to be heard thereon before commencing such construction. 15 Except as provided in section twenty-three, the construction 16 of state highways shall be paid for wholly from the pro-17 ceeds of the state bond issue herein provided for, and such 18 proceeds of the aggregate of such bonds shall be expended 19 equitably among the various counties.'

Also amend section 19 of said chapter 130 of the public 21 laws of 1913 as follows: Strike out the remaining part of 22 said section after the word "dollars" in the twenty-third line 23 and insert the following: 'shall not receive aid from the 24 state under this act,' so that section 19 as amended shall 25 read as follows:

'Sect. 19. If any town desires state aid as provided by this 27 act, for the building or permanent improvement of one or 28 more of its state aid highways, such town may raise and 29 appropriate in addition to the amounts regularly raised and 30 appropriated for the care of ways, highways and bridges 31 the following amounts on account of which state aid shall 32 be paid:

Towns having a valuation of two hundred thousand dol-34 lars or less may appropriate any amount not exceeding three 35 hundred dollars; towns having a valuation of over two hun-36 dred thousand dollars and not over eight hundred thousand 37 dollars may appropriate any amount not exceeding five hun-38 dred thirty-three dollars; towns having a valuation of over

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39 eight hundred thousand dollars and not over one million dol-40 lars may appropriate an amount not exceeding six hundred 41 dollars; and towns having a valuation of over one million 42 dollars and not over three million dollars may appropriate in 43 addition to the sum of six hundred dollars an additional sum 44 of sixty-six dollars for each two hundred thousand dollars 45 or fraction thereof valuation in excess of one million; towns 46 having a valuation of over three million dollars and not over 47 four million dollars may appropriate not exceeding one 48 thousand three hundred and thirty-three dollars; and towns 49 having a valuation of over four million dollars shall not 50 receive aid from the state under this act.'

Also amend section 31 of said chapter 130 of the public 52 laws of 1913 as follows: in place of the word "two" in the 53 sixth line of said section insert the word 'three'; in place 54 of the word "one" in the ninth line of said section insert 55 the word 'two'; in place of the words "ninety-two cents" 56 in the eleventh and twelfth lines of said section insert the 57 words 'one dollar and twenty-five cents'; in place of the 58 words "eighty-five cents" in the fifteenth line of said section 59 insert the words 'one dollar and fifteen cents'; after the 60 word "over" in the seventeenth line strike out all as far as 61 the word "the" in the twenty-first line of said section and 62 insert the following: 'two million dollars, one dollar for each 63 dollar so appropriated by said town; to each town having 64 a valuation of over two million dollars and less than three 65 million dollars, seventy-five cents for each dollar appro-

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66 priated by said town; to each town having a valuation of 67 over three million dollars and not over four million dollars, 68 fifty cents for each dollar so appropriated by said town. 69 Any deficiency in the money appropriated by the state for 70 the state aid roads necessary to carry out the provisions of 71 this act may be supplied from the money received from the 72 sale of bonds authorized by chapter 130 of the public laws 73 of 1913, which this act seeks to amend, and the commission 74 may expend or cause to be expended under its direction on 75 the state aid roads in the towns such part of the money re-76 ceived from the sale of bonds each year, not exceeding one-77 half the total amount so received, as they may determine;' 78 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 21. The commission from the fund for state aid 80 construction provided by this act shall to each town which 81 has conformed to the provisions of sections nineteen and 82 twenty for each dollar so appropriated apportion the fol-83 lowing amounts: To each town having a valuation of two 84 hundred thousand dollars or less, three dollars for each dol-85 lar appropriated by said town; to each town having a val-86 uation over two hundred thousand dollars and not over 87 one million dollars, two dollars for each dollar appropriated 88 by said town; to each town having a valuation of over one 89 million dollars and not over one million two hundred thou-90 sand dollars, one dollar and twenty-five cents for each dollar 91 appropriated by said town; to each town having a valuation 92 of over one million two hundred thousand dollars and not

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93 over one million four hundred thousand dollars, one dollar 94 and fifteen cents for each dollar appropriated by said town; 95 to each town having a valuation of over one million four 96 hundred thousand dollars and not over two million dollars, 97 one dollar for each dollar so appropriated by said town; to 98 each town having a valuation of over two million dollars and 99 less than three million dollars, seventy-five cents for each 100 dollar appropriated by said town; to each town having a 101 valuation of over three million dollars and not over four 102 million dollars, fifty cents for each dollar so appropriated 103 by said town. Any deficiency in the money appropriated 104 by the state for the state aid roads necessary to carry out 105 the provisions of this act may be supplied from the money 106 received from the sale of bonds authorized by chapter 130 107 of the public laws of 1913, which this act seeks to amend, 108 and the commission may expend or cause to be expended 100 under its direction on the state aid roads in the towns such 110 part of the money received from the sale of bonds each 111 year, not exceeding one-half the total amount so received, 112 as they may determine. The money appropriated by towns 113 applying for state aid as hereinbefore provided with the 114 amount apportioned by the commission as hereinbefore 115 provided shall constitute a joint fund for the construction 116 and permanent improvement of the state aid highways in 117 such towns."
