STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of a bridge across Mattagoodus stream in the plantation of Webster, Penobscot county.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of one thousand dollars (\$1000) to aid in building a 3 bridge across Mattagoodus Stream in the plantation of 4 Webster, county of Penobscot, provided there be appropriated by the county of Penobscot the sum of one thousand 6 dollars (\$1,000) for the same purpose, which sum, together 7 with the amount herein appropriated, shall be sufficient to 8 complete said bridge without further aid from the state. 9 And said county of Penobscot is hereby authorized to raise 10 by taxation or otherwise, within two years from the date

of the approval of this resolve, the sum herein provided for it to raise. Both sums to be expended under the supervision of the State Highway Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge is on the main travelled road between Kingman and Prentiss, Springfield, Carroll, Webster Plantation and Drew plantation, and is much used in hauling freight back and forth between all these towns. This bridge is made of old logs on each side of the stream, which are rotten and settling into the water and not safe for travel, and the plantation is not financially able to build an iron bridge across this stream.
