STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in North Branch brook and its tributaries, in the county of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of 2 fish at any time in North Branch brook, so called, in the 3 county of Cumberland, or in any of the tributaries to said 4 brook.

No person shall have in possession at any time any kind 6 of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine 8 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and 9 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar 10 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in 11 violation of any provision of this act.
