STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the town of Bridgton, in the County
of Cumberland.

Resolved. That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey to the town of Bridgton in the County of Cumberland, whatever interest the State of Maine has in and to a certain lot or parcel of land, commonly known as "The Undivided," situated in said Bridgton in the County of Cumberland, on the easterly shore of Moose Pond in said Bridgton, and bounded as follows: Beginning at the point of meeting of the westerly boundary of the land of Loton E. Brown and the easterly shore of said Moose Pond, thence northerly along said westerly boundary of the land of said Loton E. Brown, along the westerly boundary of the land of James Phineas Libby, and along the westerly boundary of the land of Mary Gray to the point of meeting of the aforesaid

14 westerly boundary of the land of said Mary Gray and the
15 easterly shore of said Moose Pond; thence in a general
16 southerly direction along the easterly shore of said Moose
17 Pond to the point of beginning. *Excepting* and reserving
18 any right, title and interest that the said State of Maine,
19 County of Cumberland or town of Bridgton may have in
20 and to the "Fryeburg Road" so called, leading from Bridg-
21 ton to Fryeburg; said road running in an easterly and west-
22 erly direction, across the above bounded and described land.
