AN ACT to confer additional Rights and Powers upon the East Branch Improvement Company, a corporation incorporated by a special act of the Legislature, approved March eighteenth, nineteen hundred and three.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. The East Branch Improvement Company, a  
2 corporation incorporated by a special act of the Legislature  
3 of Maine, entitled "An Act to incorporate the East Branch  
4 Improvement Company," approved March eighteenth, nine-  
5 teen hundred and three, is hereby authorized and empow-  
6 ered to demand and receive a toll on all logs and lumber  
7 intended to be driven down the East Branch of the Penob-

8 scot river and coming into said river below Grand Lake  
9 Dam, as follows: Ten cents for each thousand feet, board  
10 measure, on all logs and lumber landed in, or driven into  
11 said river between Grand Lake Dam and the north line of  
12 Township Number two (2), Range seven (7), W. E. L. S.  
13 and five cents for each thousand feet, board measure, on  
14 all logs and lumber coming into said river between said  
15 north line of Township Number two (2), Range seven (7),  
16 W. E. L. S. and the junction of the east and west branches  
17 of the Penobscot river at Medway.

Sect. 2. Said corporation shall have a lien upon all such  
2 logs and lumber for the payment of said toll, to be enforced  
3 by attachment in an action of assumpsit brought to recover  
4 such toll, but the logs of each particular mark shall be holden  
5 only for the toll of such mark.
