STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Provide for the Dressing of Poultry and Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever, acting for himself, or as the agent
2 or employee of another, knowingly or wilfully sells or of-
3 fers for sale for the purpose of food, any poultry, or game
4 birds from which the intestines and crop have not been
5 drawn or removed at the time of killing, shall be punished
6 on conviction by a fine of ten dollars for the first offense
7 and twenty-five dollars for every subsequent offense, to be
8 recovered on complaint.

Sect. 2. This act shall not apply to the selling of poultry
2 or game to persons, who, because of religious beliefs or
3 for other reasons desire their poultry or game furnished
4 in an undressed condition.
