STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to provide safety appliances for cars running on street railways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. On and after the first day of November, A. 2 D. 1915, it shall be unlawful for any person, company, cor-3 poration or association owning or operating any railway 4 company operated or controlled by electricity, and doing 5 business in the state of Maine, to run any railway, or street 6 car over, upon or along any street or highway within the 7 state, unless such car shall be equipped with a safety device 8 commonly known and called a fender.

Sect. 2. The term fender as hereinbefore used shall be

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2 deemed to mean an attachment devised to prevent accidents3 and shall be of such form, and attached to the car or cars4 in manner approved by the public utilities commission.

Sect. 3. Upon proper representation made to the public 2 utilities commission, and after hearing thereon, the time 3 when such fenders shall be put in use upon cars operated 4 as aforesaid may be extended but not in any event shall 5 such extension of time be beyond January 1st, A. D. 1916.

Sect. 4. Any person, company, corporation or association 2 failing to equip cars operated as aforesaid shall be punished 3 by a fine not exceeding ten dollars a day for each and every 4 car in service without said equipment. Said fine to be re-5 covered in manner and form as provided for in criminal 6 matters.

Sect. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
