STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT making it unlawful for persons to falsely represent themselves as deaf, dumb, blind, crippled or otherwise defective.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any person engaged in soliciting, procuring or attempting 2 to solicit or procure money or other thing of value by falsely 3 pretending and representing himself or herself to be deaf, 4 dumb, blind, crippled or physically defective shall upon con-5 viction thereof be imprisoned for a period not exceeding
