STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Chapter 49, Sec. 4, § VII, relating to the insurance policy becoming void by vacancy of the premises without the insurers' written permission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Chapter 49, Sec. 4, VII, is amended by inserting
the words 'and continue vacant until the time of the fire'
after the words "remain vacant for more than thirty days
without such assent" in the paragraph commencing with the
words "this policy shall be void," so that this paragraph shall
read as follows:

'This policy shall be void if any material fact or circum-8 stance stated in writing has not been fairly represented by 9 the insured, or if the insured now has or shall hereafter to make any other insurance on the said property without the 11 assent in writing or in print of the company, or if, with-12 out such assent, the said property shall be removed, except 13 that, if such removal shall be necessary for the preservation 14 of the property from fire, this policy shall be valid without 15 such assent for five days thereafter, or if, without such 16 assent, the situation or circumstances affecting the risk shall. 17 by or with the knowledge, advice, agency, or consent of the 18 insured, be so altered as to cause an increase of such risks, 10 or if, without such assent, the said property shall be sold, 20 or this policy assigned, or if the premises hereby insured 21 shall become vacant by the removal of the owner or occu-22 pant, and so remain vacant for more than thirty days with-23 out such assent, and continue vacant until the time of the 24 fire, or if it be a manufacturing establishment, running in 25 whole or in part extra time, except that such establishments 26 may run in whole or in part extra hours, not later than nine 27 o'clock P. M., or if such establishments shall cease opera-28 tions for more than thirty days without permission in writ-29 ing indorsed hereon, or if the insured shall make any at-30 tempt to defraud the company, either before or after the 31 loss, or if gunpowder or other articles subject to legal re-32 striction, shall be kept in quantities or manner different from 33 those allowed or prescribed by law, or if camphene, benzine, 34 naphtha, or other chemical oils or burning fluids shall be 35 kept or used by the insured on the premises insured, except 36 that what is known as refined petroleum, kerosene, or coal 37 oil, may be used for lighting, and in dwelling-houses, kero-38 sene oil stoves may be used for domestic purposes, to be 39 filled when cold, by daylight, and with oil of lawful fire test 40 only.
