RESOLVE, in favor of Kennebec county issuing bonds.

---

*Resolved,* That the treasurer of the county of Kennebec is  
2 authorized to procure by loan, on the faith and respon-  
3 sibility of said county, a sum of money not exceeding twenty  
4 thousand dollars, exclusive of and in addition to loans au-  
5 thorized by section sixteen of chapter eighty of the revised  
6 statutes, as it has been or may be amended, to be expended  
7 by and under the direction of the county commissioners  
8 of said county, for the purpose of paying off the indebted-  
9 ness of said county incurred by building a work-shop in  
10 connection with the county jail, and in paying the amount  
11 required by chapter two hundred thirty-one of the Resolves  
12 of the State of Maine for 1909, in aid of building the bridge  
13 across the Kennebec river between the towns of Fairfield  
14 and Clinton in the counties of Somerset and Kennebec, and

15 the said treasurer is hereby authorized to issue bonds of  
16 said county with interest coupons attached, to the amount  
17 of said loan; said bonds to bear interest, payable semi-an-  
18 nually, at a rate not exceeding four and one half per cent  
19 per annum, the principal to be payable at such times, not  
20 later than twenty years from the date thereof, as said com-  
21 missioners may fix, and with or without provisions for a  
22 sinking fund; said bonds to be signed by the treasurer and  
23 countersigned by the county commissioners of said county,  
24 and the coupons to be signed by said treasurer.
