STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, making Appropriation for Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians for the years one thousand nine hundred and fifteen and sixteen.

---

Whereas, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit, \$66,032.78; and whereas all funds appropriated by the seventy-sixth Legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing.

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for in the resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the

opinion of this Legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated in the Constitution, be it therefore

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the state treasury to be  
 2 expended under the direction of the Governor and Council  
 3 to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for the  
 4 benefit of said tribe for the years 1915-1916 as follows:

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve provides the regular funds for care and maintenance of the members of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians together with certain amounts asked for improvement of buildings and equipment made necessary by conditions existing at Pleasant Point and Peter Dana's Point.
