STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section nine of chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to the taking of suckers, eels, hornpouts and yellow perch with eel pots, traps, spears, or nets.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section nine of chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes,
2 as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the public
3 laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, is hereby amended
4 by striking out all of said section and by substituting there5 for the following section:

HOUSE-No. 270.

'Sect. 9. Suckers, eels, hornpouts and yellow perch may 7 be taken with eel pots, traps, spears or nets, in such inland 8 waters and under such rules and regulations as may be es-9 tablish by the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Said commissioners shall establish and designate by public 11 notice the waters in which suckers, eels, hornpouts and yel-12 low perch may be taken as provided in this section.

It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill 14 or destroy any suckers, eels, hornpouts or yellow perch, or 15 to have in possession any of said fish, in violation of any 16 provision of this section.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall pay a 18 fine of thirty dollars and costs for each offense.'
