STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Secretary of the Committee on Indian Affairs, to defray expenses of said committee in visiting the Reservations at Pleasant Point and Old Town.

Resolved, That there be paid to Frank P. Washburn, secretary of the Committee on Indian Affairs in the seventy-seventh legislature, the sum of two hundred one dollars (\$201) and thirteen cents (13c.), being the amount of expenses incurred by said committee in visiting the Indian reservations at Pleasant Point and Old Town.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On Feb. 5-6-8 the Committee on Indian Affairs of the Seventy-seventh Legislature visited the reservations at Pleasant Point and Old Town for the purpose of inspecting the same and learning of conditions there.
