STATE OF MAINE

Memorial to Congress relative to Retirement and Pensions of Civil Service Employees.

Whereas, Every civilized nation in the world, except the United States, has found it necessary in the interest of economy and efficiency in the conduct of its government to enact laws for the retirement of its superannuated civil service employees; and

Whereas, The large railroad companies and industrial corporations of this country have proved it to be good business policy to retire their old and disabled employees on an annuity as a reward for long and faithful service; and

Whereas, The enactment of a law for the retirement of over 5000 superannuated employees in the civil service of the United States would add materially to its efficiency and economy by the infusion of young blood at the minimum wages in place of worn-out men at the maximum wage; and

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Whereas, There is pending in congress at present a measure known as the Hamil Bill, H. R. 5139, which, if enacted into law, will provide for the retirement of superannuated employees in the civil service; therefore, be it

Resolved, That the 77th Legislature of the State of Maine 2 does hereby heartily endorse said bill and request that fa-3 vorable action be taken thereon; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be forwarded to 5 the President of the United States, to the chairman of the 6 Civil Service Reform in both branches of Congress, and to 7 the Senators and Representatives of this state.

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. May 15, 1913.

Mr. HAMILL introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Reform in the Civil Service and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

To provide for the retirement of employees in the civil service. Civil Service Employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That beginning with the first day of July next following the passage of this Act all employees in the classified civil service shall be eligible for retirement as hereinafter provided.

7 Sec. 2. That any employee in the classified civil serv-8 ice who has served the United States for thirty years or 9 more shall, upon his or her request, be retired from the 10 service on an annuity of fifty per centum of his or her annual 11 salary based upon the average annual salary, pay, or com-12 pensation he or she may have received for the five years

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1 next preceding retirement. Any employee in the classified 2 civil service who has served the United States for a period 3 of from twenty-five to thirty years shall, upon his or her 4 request, be retired from the service on an annuity of forty-5 five per centum of his or her annual salary based upon the 6 average annual salary, pay, or compensation he or she may 7 have received for the five years next preceding retirement. 8 Any employee in the classified civil service who has served 9 the United States for a period of from twenty to twenty-five 10 years shall, upon his or her request, be retired from the 11 service on an annuity of forty per centum of his or her 12 annual salary based upon the average annual salary, pay, 13 or compensation he or she may have received for the five 14 years next preceding retirement.

15 Sec. 3. That no employee provided for in this Act 16 shall be retained in the service after arriving at the age of 17 seventy years.

18 Sect. 4. That the payments provided for in this Act 19 shall be paid quarterly throughout the life of the employee. 20 Sec. 5. That any employee to whom this Act applies 21 who has served the United States for not less than five years, 22 and who, by reason of accident or illness not due to vicious 23 habits and without fault or delinquency on his or her part, 24 has become disabled shall be retired from the service on 25 certificate from the head of the department or independent

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I office in which he or she is employed to the Secretary of 2 the Treasury setting forth such disabilities, and on the ap-3 proval of the Secretary of the Treasury he or she shall receive 4 an annuity, payable quarterly, of thirty per centum of his 5 or her annual salary, based upon his or her average annual 6 salary, pay, or compensation for the five years next preceding 7 his or her retirement, for from five to ten years of service; 8 forty per centum for from ten to twenty years of service; 9 fifty per centum for from twenty-one years and over.

Sec. 6. That for the purposes of this Act the period of service shall be computed from original employment, whether as a classified or unclassified employee, and shall include periods of service at different times, and service in one or more departments, branches, or independent offices of the Sovernment, the Signal Corps prior to July first, eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and the general service in or under the War Department prior to May sixth, eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

19 Sec. 7. That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby 20 authorized and directed to pay, out of any moneys in the 21 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to 22 carry out the purposes of this Act.

23 Sec. 8. That the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby 24 authorized to perform or cause to be performed any and all

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I acts and to make such rules and regulations as may be neces-2 sary and proper for the purpose of carrying the provisions3 of this Act into full force and effect.
