STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Sarah A. Robinson of Mt. Vernon.

Resolved, That the sum of twelve dollars per month beginning with January first, nineteen hundred and fifteen, shall be paid to Sarah A. Robinson of Mt. Vernon, widow of Freeman W. Robinson, a veteran of the Civil War, deceased, to continue during the pleasure of the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Sarah A. Robinson is the widow of Freeman W. Robinson, who is now deceased. Her husband enlisted in Company I, of the 11th Maine Infantry, but was afterwards transferred to the navy and served on board the ships Tristan, Shandy, and Boxer. Mrs. Robinson is eighty-eight (88) years of age, has lost the use of one eye entirely and is almost blind in the other. She is very lame in one knee and is unable to move about the house without the help of some other person. She has no property, whatever, and is cared for by relatives who are not able to bear the expense, yet will do so rather than to ask outside assistance.
