### STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred eighty-two of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred seven providing that flags shall be furnished to schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Chapter one hundred eighty-two of the public laws of nine2 teen hundred seven is hereby amended by striking out all
3 of said chapter preceding the word "to" in the seventh line
4 thereof and by inserting in place thereof the following:

'It shall be the duty of superintendents of schools to see 6 that the flag is displayed from all public school buildings 7 on all days when the public schools are in session. Said 8 superintendents shall report annually to towns the amount

9 necessary to furnish the public schools with suitable flags 10 and flag staffs and towns shall annually appropriate a suffi-11 cient amount to defray the necessary cost of the display of 12 the flag. The appropriation for this purpose shall be sepa-13 rate from and additional to all other appropriations for 14 schools. It shall be the duty of instructors to impress upon 15 the youth by suitable references and observances the signfi-16 cance of the flag,' so that said chapter when amended shall 17 read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be the duty of superintendents of 10 schools to see that the flag is displayed from all public school 20 buildings on all days when the public schools are in session. 21 Said superintendents shall report annually to towns the 22 amount necessary to furnish the public schools with suitable 23 flags and flag staffs and towns shall annually appropriate 24 a sufficient amount to defray the necessary cost of the dis-25 play of the flag. The appropriation for this purpose shall 26 be separate from and additional to all other appropriations 27 for schools. It shall be the duty of instructors to impress 28 upon the youth by suitable references and observances the 29 significance of the flag, to teach them the cost, the object 30 and principles of our government, the great sacrifices of 31 our forefathers, the important part taken by the Union army 32 in eighteen hundred sixty-one to eighteen hundred sixty-five, 33 and to teach them to love, honor and respect the flag of our 34 country that cost so much and is so dear to every true 35 American citizen.'
