STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section thirty-six of Chapter one hundred and one of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter forty-one of the Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, in relation to Bail Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter forty-one of the Laws of nineteen hundred and
2 seven is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence in
3 said chapter so that said chapter, as amended, shall read
4 as follows:

'Sect. 36. Any person under arrest on criminal process
6 for a bailable offense, may, before commitment to jail, if he
7 so requests, be taken by the officer having him in charge,

8 before such commissioner, who may inquire into the case.
9 and admit him to bail. And any person arrested on the
10 Lord's day, or on the afternoon or evening preceding, for a
11 bailable offense, may be admitted to bail on that day by
12 such commissioner.'
