## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Section one of Chapter eighty-one of the Public Laws of Nineteen hundred and thirteen Relating to Sealing Milk Bottles and Jars.

Bc it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The fourth paragraph of section one of chapter eighty-one 2 of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen is here-3 by amended by inserting after the first sentence of said sec-4 tion the following sentence: "The designating number and 5 the words "Maine Seal" shall be marked on the outside of 6 the upper half of each bottle,' and by inserting after the 7 word "bond" in the eighth line of said paragraph the words 8 'payable to the state,' so that said paragraph as amended 9 shall read as follows:

#### HOUSE-No. 361.

'Such bottles or jars as are sealed by the manufacturer shall 11 be marked with the name, initials or trade mark of the man-12 ufacturer, and designating number, which designating num-13 ber shall be different for each manufacturer and may be 14 used in identifying the bottles. The designating number 15 and the words "Maine Seal" shall be marked on the outside of 16 the upper half of each bottle. The designating number shall 17 be furnished by the state sealer of weights and measures up-18 on application by the manufacturer, and upon filing by the 19 manufacturer, with the treasurer of state, of a bond payable 20 to the state in the sum of one thousand dollars with sureties 21 to be approved by the attorney general, conditioned upon his 22 conformance with this section. A record of the bonds fur-23 nished, the designating numbers and to whom furnished, 24 shall be kept in the office of the state sealer of weights and 25 measures.'
