STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section twenty-five of Chapter twenty-
eight of the Revised Statutes of one thousand nine hundred
and three, relating to appointment of Inspector of buildings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-five of Chapter twenty-eight of the Re-
vised Statutes of one thousand nine hundred and three is
hereby amended by adding after the words "of more than
two thousand inhabitants," in the first line, the words 'and
in every town of two thousand inhabitants or less, if such
town shall so vote at an annual town meeting,' so that said
section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 25. In every town and city of more than two
9 thousand inhabitants, and in every town of two thousand
10 inhabitants or less, if such town shall so vote at an annual
11 town meeting, the municipal officers shall annually in the
12 month of April appoint an inspector of buildings, who shall
13 be a man skilled in the construction of buildings, and shall
14 determine his compensation. The municipal officers shall
15 define the limits within which the inspector of buildings
16 shall have jurisdiction, which shall include the thickly-set-
17 tled portion of each such city, or of each village in each
18 such city or town.'
