STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to ice fishing in Tilton, David and Basin Ponds, in the town of Fayette, in the county of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of
2 fish, at any time, on or through the ice, in Tilton pond, or
3 in David pond, or in Basin pond, in the town of Fayette,
4 in the county of Kennebec.

No person shall have in possession, at any time, any kind
6 of fish taken on or through the ice in either of the above
7 named ponds.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine
9 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and
10 costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar
11 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in
12 violation of any provision of this act.
