STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section two of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to ice fishing in Big Indian Pond, in St. Albans, in the county of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. So much of section two of chapter thirty-two 2 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred 3 and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, 4 as prohibits fishing through the ice, in accordance with the

5 general law of the state relating to ice fishing, on Tuesday

6 and Friday of each week, in Big Indian pond, in St. Albans, 7 in the county of Somerset, is hereby repealed.

Provided, however, it shall be unlawful for any person to 9 take, catch or kill in any one day more than five fish in all 10 while fishing through the ice in said pond.

No person shall have in possession, in any one day, more 12 than five fish in all taken through the ice in said pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty 3 dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto 4 one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.
