STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to further amend section sixty-two of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter forty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, and by chapter eighty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and eleven, relating to High Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section sixty-two of chapter fifteen of the revised statutes
2 as amended by chapter forty-eight of the public laws of
3 nineteen hundred and five, and by chapter eighty-eight of
4 the public laws of nineteen hundred and eleven, is hereby
5 further amended by striking out the words "ten thousand"
6 in the thirteenth and fourteenth lines of said section as last

7 amended, and substituting in place thereof the words 'twen-8 ty-five thousand,' so that said section as amended shall read 9 as follows:

'Sect. 62. Any town which does not maintain a free high 11 school of standard grade may, from year to year, authorize 12 its superintending school committee to contract with and 13 pay the superintending school committee of any adjoining 14 town or the trustees of any academy located within such 15 town or in an adjoining town, for the tuition of scholars 16 within said town in the studies contemplated by the seven 17 preceding sections. When such contract has been made with 18 the trustees of an academy a joint committee for the selec-10 tion of teachers and the arrangement for the course of study 20 in such academy shall include the superintending school 21 committees of the contracting towns with an equal number 22 of the members of the board of trustees of such academy 23 when such academy has less than twenty-five thousand dol-24 lars endowment. The expenditure of any town for tuition 25 as provided in this section shall be subject to the same con-26 ditions and shall entitle such town to the same state aid as 27 if it had made such expenditure for a free high school."
