STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Meadow Brook and its tributaries, in Stockton Springs and Prospect, in the county of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any
kind of fish at any time in Meadow brook, so-called, in
Stockton Springs and in Prospect, in the county of Waldo,
or in any of its tributaries; nor shall any person have in
possession at any time any kind of fish taken in any of said
waters.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of section one of 2 this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten nor more than 3 thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition 4 thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had 5 in possession in violation of any provision of said section.
