IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

RESOLVE, in favor of the City of Old Town.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty-six dol-
2 lars and fifty cents (\$156.50) be and hereby is appropriated
3 to be paid to the City of Old Town to reimburse said City
4 of Old Town for amount expended by it for support and
5 medical treatment of Edward Langlais, Charles Fountain,
6 David Campbell, Matthew Lestange, Thomas Porter and
7 James Marsden, state paupers.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In the year nineteen hundred and twelve the City of Old Town paid to the Old Town Hospital Company for board and treatment of the paupers, named in the accompanying resolve, at the Old Town City Hospital the following, viz.:

Edward Langlais	\$43.00
Charles Fountain	19.00
David Campbell	33.00
Matthew Lestange	8.00
Thomas Porter	28.00
James Marsden	25.50

Total	\$156.50

The vouchers for the above amounts, duly signed by one of the overseers of the poor and accompanied by a receipted bill in each case, were duly sent to the State Department. Through inadvertence the affidavit which should have been signed in each case by the pauper was not obtained, and, consequently did not accompany the vouchers sent to the State Department. It appears that the paupers have now left the City of Old Town, and had left the city before the overseers of the poor, in office at that time, knew that it was necessary to take these affidavits. Therefore, vouchers, in each case, were returned to the overseers of the poor by the State Department, and as it is not now possible to obtain the affidavits from the paupers, this resolve is introduced asking that the state reimburse said City of Old Town for the several amounts expended in these cases as above set forth.
