STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, Providing a State Pension for Eliza E. Philbrook.

Resolved, That there be paid Eliza E. Philbrook of Kittery, the sum of eight dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, to begin January first, nineteen hundred fifteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE
RESOLVE FOR ELIZA E. PHILBROOK OF KIT-
TERY.

Eliza E. Philbrook is the widow of James A. Philbrook, a former resident of York, who served in the War of the Rebellion, having mustered into the service at Augusta, Maine, September 6, 1861, as Private in Company B, 2nd Regiment, Maine Infantry, transferred to Company B, 20th Regiment, Maine Infantry, on June 4, 1863, and mustered out and honorably discharged on September 16, 1864, at the expiration of his term of service. Mrs. Philbrook at one time had a residence in the State of Maine but moved to Boston, Massachusetts, and thereby lost her legal residence in this state. She is not entitled to state aid until she has lived within the state for five years, under Revised Statutes, Chapter 145. Mrs. Philbrook is seventy years of age and in a feeble condition. She now receives twelve dollars a month from the Federal Government, which is inadequate for her maintenance and care and she must have aid from some charitable source if the state does not come to her relief.
