RESOLVE, in favor of Lucy A. Owens.

Resolved, That there be paid Lucy A. Owens of Sher-
2 man, Aroostook County, Maine, the sum of ten dollars per
3 month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for
4 military pensions, to begin January first, nineteen hundred
5 fifteen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Lucy A. Owens is the widow of the late James Owens, late of Lubec, Maine, deceased, who served in the late war of the Rebellion in the navy as landsman on U. S. S. Ohio, Potomac and Penguin and who died in Lubec June 7, 1910.

She received a U. S. pension of ten dollars per month under pension certificate No. 712,557. She has no property whatever and her health is such that she is unable to work for a living. She was born at Lubec, October 3, 1846, and is therefore sixty-eight years of age. Her physical condition is described by physicians as "general debility"—"weak and rapid action of the heart"—"chronic bronchial cought."

Her U. S. pension is insufficient to pay even a fair amount for board and leaves nothing with which to supply clothing, medicine and medical attendance, all of which are necessary.

She has received a state pension when living at Lubec until last year when she removed to Sherman.
