STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Section One of Chapter Ninety of the Public Laws of Nineteen hundred and eleven, entitled An Act relating to the Protection of Smelts along the coast of Maine from Casco Bay to Penobscot Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter ninety of the public laws of nine-2 teen hundred and eleven is hereby amended by adding to 3 said section the following words 'this act shall not apply 4 to the waters along the coast of Maine between Martin's 5 Point and White Head in the county of Knox,' so that said 6 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. I. No smelts shall be taken or fished for in the tidal

8 waters along the coast of Maine within one half mile of the 9 coast line at mean high water mark, starting from Cape 10 Small Point on the west bank of Kennebec river and con-11 tinuing easterly along the cost of Maine to Owl's Head in 12 Penobscot bay, except by hook and line or weirs or set nets 13 through the ice, under penalty of not less than ten nor more 14 than fifty dollars for each offense. This act shall not apply 15 to the waters along the coast of Maine between Martin's 16 Point and White Head in the county of Knox.'
