STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter three hundred
twenty-five of the private and special laws of eighteen hun-
dred ninety-seven, fixing the salary for the Recorder of the
Municipal Court of Waterville.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eight of chapter three hundred twenty-five of the
2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-seven
3 is hereby amended by striking out, after the word "judge"
4 in the eleventh line thereof, the remainder of said section
5 and substituting in the place thereof the following:

'The recorder shall receive from said city, in monthly pay-
7 ments, an annual salary of five hundred dollars, which shall

8 be in full for all fees pertaining to his office,' so that said
9 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. There shall be appointed by the governor, for
11 said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said
12 court when requested so to do by the judge; and in case of
13 absence from the court room, or sickness of the judge, or
14 when the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall
15 have and exercise all the powers of the judge, and perform
16 all the duties required of said judge by this act, and shall
17 be empowered to sign and issue all processes and papers,
18 and to do all acts as fully and with the same effect as the
19 judge could do were he acting in the premises; and the sig-
20 nature of the recorder, as such, shall be sufficient evidence
21 of his right to act instead of the judge. The recorder shall
22 receive from said city, in monthly payments, an annual sal-
23 ary of five hundred dollars, which shall be in full for all
24 fees pertaining to his office.'
