STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend Sections twenty-one and twenty-two of Chapter one hundred and twenty-three of the Revised Statutes relating to Obstructing Officers in the Discharge of their Duties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. Section twenty-one of chapter one hundred
and twenty-three of the revised statutes is hereby amended
by inserting after the word "either" in the third line the
4 following: 'or whoever obstructs a fish warden while in
5 the lawful discharge of his official duty, whether with or
6 without process,' so that said section as amended shall read
7 as follows:

'Sect. 21. Whoever wilfully obstructs such officer or per-

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9 son in the service of any civil process or order, or of any 10 process for an offense punishable by jail imprisonment or 11 fine, or either, or whoever obstructs a fish warden while 12 in the lawful discharge of his official duty, whether with or 13 without process, shall be punished by imprisonment not 14 exceeding one year and by fine not exceeding three hun-15 dred dollars.'

Sect. 2. Section twenty-two of chapter one hundred and 2 twenty-three of the revised statutes is hereby amended by 3 inserting after the word "constable" in the third line the 4 words 'fish warden,' so that said section as amended shall 5 read as follows:

'Sect. 22. Whoever assaults, intimidates or in any man-7 ner wilfully obstructs, intimidates or hinders any sheriff, 8 deputy sheriff, coroner, constable, fish warden or police 9 officer while in the lawful discharge of his official duties, 10 whether with or without process, shall be punished by im-11 prisonment not exceeding one year or by fine not exceeding 12 five hundred dollars.'
