STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, In favor of George F. Phillips for State Pension.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the
2 State to George F. Phillips of Levant, a pension of twelve
3 dollars per month, beginning on the first day of January, one
4 thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and to continue during
5 the pleasure of the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

George F. Phillips is the son of a deceased soldier. When about five years old he had a fever which left him with a very crooked spine and poor health. He has never been able to do hard work and not much light work. His mother supported and made a home for him until her death about two years ago. He has no near relatives able to support him and is liable soon to become a town charge.
