STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT making it unlawful for persons to falsely represent themselves as deaf, dumb, blind, crippled or otherwise defective.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Any person engaged in soliciting, procuring or attempt-2 ing to solicit or procure money or other thing of value by 3 falsely pretending and representing himself or herself to be 4 deaf, dumb, blind, crippled or physically defective, shall 5 upon conviction thereof be imprisoned for a period not ex-6 ceeding ninety days.
