AN ACT to amend Section 1 of Chapter 380 of the Private  
and Special Laws of 1909, relating to the taking of lobsters  
and setting lobster traps in the waters of Gouldsboro and  
other towns.

---

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1 of chapter 380 of the private and special laws  
2 of 1909 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "and"  
3 in the fourth line thereof the words, 'no person shall set any  
4 lobster trap under a penalty of,' so that said section, as  
5 amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy  
7 any lobsters between the first day of July and the first day

8 of September in each year under a penalty of one dollar for  
9 each lobster so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, and no  
10 person shall set any lobster trap under a penalty of five  
11 dollars for each lobster trap set, in the waters of the towns  
12 of Gouldsboro, Eden, Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Sullivan  
13 and Sorrento, within the following points: Commencing at  
14 Jordan's Island channel in the town of Gouldsboro, thence  
15 running southwest by south to the eastern head of Egg Rock,  
16 so called, thence in a straight line to whistling buoy, south  
17 of Egg Rock, thence due south two miles, thence in a straight  
18 line to stone beacon on East Bunker's ledge, thence in a  
19 straight line to Seal Harbor Head, thence following the shore  
20 of Mount Desert island in an easterly and northerly direc-  
21 tion to Mount Desert bridge, thence in a north direction  
22 to town of Trenton, thence easterly by the shores of the  
23 towns of Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Sullivan, Sorrento  
24 and Gouldsboro to place of beginning.'
