STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to amend section thirty-eight of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to the closed season on wild hares or rabbits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section thirty-eight of chapter thirty-two of the revised 2 statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of 3 the public laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, is hereby 4 amended by striking out the word "and" after the word 5 "July" in the fourth line of said section and by inserting 6 the words 'and September' after the word "August" in the 7 fourth line of said section, so that said section, as amended, 8 shall read as follows:

HOUSE—No. 589.

Sect. 38. There shall be an annual closed season on wild 10 hares or rabbits during which closed season it shall be un-11 lawful to hunt, kill, catch, pursue or have them in posses-12 sion, except alive, during the months of April, May, June, 13 July, August and September of each year.

It shall be unlawful to use any snares, traps or other de-15 vices in the hunting, pursuing or killing of wild hares or 16 rabbits, or to hunt or kill the same except in the ordinary 17 method of shooting with guns in the usual manner; pro-18 vided, however, that it shall be lawful to catch wild hares 19 or rabbits in common box traps during the open season pro-20 vided in this section.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this section shall 22 pay a fine of ten dollars and costs for each offense.'
