STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to the hunting of water fowl and other wild birds in Back Bay, so called, in Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any
2 water fowl or any other wild bird at any time in Back bay,
3 so called, in Portland, in the county of Cumberland, above
4 the Grand Trunk railway bridge.

No person shall have in possession at any time any water

6 fowl or any other wild bird taken in violation of any pro-
7 vision of this act.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine
9 of ten dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition
10 thereto one dollar for each bird taken, caught, killed, de-
11 stroyed or had in possession in violation of any provision
12 of this act.
