STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN**

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and thirteen, relating to fishing in Tufts, Dutton and Grindstone Ponds, in the town of Kingfield, Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person shall take, catch or kill more than ten trout and 2 landlocked salmon in all in any one day in Tufts, Dutton 3 and Grindstone ponds, in the town of Kingfield, in Frank- 4 lin county, nor shall any person have in possession in any 5 one day more than ten trout and landlocked salmon in all 6 taken in said waters.

Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine
8 of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and
9 costs of prosecution for each offense ; and in addition thereto
10 one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in pos-
11 session in violation of any provision of this act.
