STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of aid in repairing the Lake Road in Oxford county.

Resolved, that there be and hereby is appropriated the sum 2 of five hundred dollars (\$500) for one year only for the 3 purpose of repairing the Lake road, so called, in township C 4 and C surplus in Oxford county; said appropriation to be 5 expended under the supervision of the State Highway De-6 partment; and provided that this resolve shall be void and 7 of no effect unless said town in accepting this appropriation 8 thereby and in consideration thereof shall undertake that all 9 road material, including clay, gravel, sand and rock, necessor sary for the improvement contemplated by this resolve shall 11 be furnished without expense to the State, and that said 12 town shall assume and pay all damages whatsoever arising

13 from the taking of land or from the change of grade, drain-14 age or alignment deemed by the State Highway Commis-15 sion as necessary for said improvement. Said way when 16 so improved shall be thereafter continually maintained 17 under the direction and control of said Commission at the 18 joint expense of the State and said town; the charge against 10 said town for maintenance of said way shall not exceed 20 fifty percentum of the actual cost of such maintenance nor 21 an average of thirty dollars per mile per annum, and the 22 payment by said town of its said share of said maintenance 23 shall be enforced in the same manner as provided in sections 24 ten and twenty-five of Chapter one hundred thirty of the 25 Public Laws of Ninteen Hundred and Thirteen. The share 26 of the State in said maintenance shall be paid out of the 27 fund for administration and maintenance created by virtue 28 of section thirty-three of said chapter one hundred and 29 thirty.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road leads from the Byron road in the town of Andover to the south arm of Richardson lake, so called, and is about nine miles in length. There is no settlement on the road. The first two miles of it are in the town of Andover and the balance in Andover North Surplus and C township. The road where it leaves the south arm of Richardson lake is about four miles from Middle Dam, which is a noted sportsmen's and tourists' retreat. Steamers run from Middle Dam to the South Arm, where is a small hotel or sportsmen's camp which is used to a great extent to entertain the public, and this is used by tourists with automobiles as well as teams with horses and is a great convenience to the tourists outside of Maine as well as the public in Maine.

This amount of money will put the road in comparatively good shape so that very little expense will be incurred in repairing hereafter.
