STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Forty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-nine, as Relating to the Policeman of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section One of Chapter Forty-nine of the Private and Spe-2 cial Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-nine is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the word "Election" in the ninth
4 line of said Section One, the words 'or until his successor
5 has been commissioned and duly qualified'; so that said Sec-6 tion, as hereby amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1. At the biennial election of the Penobscot Tribe 8 of Indians for choice of governor and lieutenant governor

9 and representative to the state legislature, the party voting 10 at such election shall also choose a member of said tribe to 11 be a policeman. The agent of said tribe shall certify such 12 choice to the governor of this state; and if such choice is rat-13 ified by the governor of the state and the council, the gov-14 ernor shall issue a commission to the person thus chosen, said 15 commission to be for the term of two years from the date of 16 such election or until his successor has been commissioned 17 and duly qualified. In the enforcement of the laws of this 18 state within the limits of the reservation of said tribe, said 19 policeman shall have like powers and duties with constables 20 and policemen within towns and cities, and authority to take 21 any offender before any court of competent jurisdiction with-22 in his county. He shall receive from the contingent fund of 23 the state a salary of fifty dollars each year.
