STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIFTEEN

AN ACT to revive and extend the powers of the Kingman
Developing Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Kingman Develop-
2 ing Company which were granted by Chapter three hundred
3 twenty-three of the private and special laws of nineteen
4 hundred and seven, as revived and extended by chapter two
5 hundred fifty-two of the private and special laws of nine-
6 teen hundred and eleven, are hereby revived and extended
7 for two years from the date when this act shall take effect;
8 and the persons named in said original act, their associates

9 and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and priv-
10 ileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised
11 in the same manner and for the same purposes as therein
12 specified.

Chapter three hundred and twenty-three of the private and
14 special laws of the year one thousand nine hundred and
15 seven is hereby revived and continued in force and the cor-
16 porators named therein are hereby given a further period
17 of two years from the date that this act shall take effect in
18 which to organize and commence business under said act.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This charter was taken out for the purpose of developing the water power on the Mattawamkeag River at the village of Kingman, Penobscot County. This power was for many years used by a tannery located at the village. The power was developed by means of a wooden dam and a canal to the tannery. For various reasons the development of this power has been postponed but the corporators intend during the ensuing year to make a development of this power by means of a concrete dam at or near the location of the former dam.

Kingman has at the present time no industry and without this development of the water power little progress can be made in advancing prosperity of the town.
