AN ACT to amend The Military Law.

---

Senate Amendment A.

Amend section forty-five of chapter two hundred and six  
2 of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine by strik-  
3 ing out all of said section after the word "for" in the eighth  
4 line and substituting therefor the following: 'each division  
5 commander shall be allowed a sum not exceeding fifty dol-  
6 lars per annum for the care and responsibility of public  
7 property for which he is accountable; the executive officer  
8 of the ship's company, each division clerk and the third  
9 class yeomen of each division shall receive for their services

10 a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars per annum.' So  
11 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 45. The pay of officers and petty officers of the  
13 naval reserve shall be the same as that of officers and non-  
14 commissioned officers of the same relative rank in the na-  
15 tional guard; and seamen shall receive the pay of privates  
16 of infantry. The commanding officer of the ship's company  
17 shall be allowed a sum not exceeding fifty dollars per an-  
18 num for the care and responsibility of such state and  
19 United States property as he may be accountable for; each  
20 division commander shall be allowed a sum not exceeding  
21 fifty dollars per annum for the care and responsibility of pub-  
22 lic property for which he is accountable; the executive offi-  
23 cer of the ship's company, each division clerk and the third  
24 class yeomen of each division shall receive for their serv-  
25 ices a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars per annum.'
