AMENDMENT "A"—HOUSE BILL NO 583.

Amend Section 89 in the 10th line after the word "dollars"
2 by adding the words 'and fifty cents,' so that said section as
3 amended shall read as follows:

Sect. 80. If any town does not choose assessors, the 5 selectmen shall be the assessors, and each of them shall be 6 sworn as an assessor; and each selectman and assessor shall 7 be paid for his services, two dollars and fifty cents for every 8 day necessary and actually employed in the service of the 9 town. Towns having three thousand or more inhabitants 10 may vote to pay their selectmen a compensation not exceeding five dollars a day for time actually spent in the service of the town, and any town having less than three thousand

13 inhabitants may, by major vote at its annual town meeting 14 fix the compensation of its board of selectmen, allowing 15 such sum as may be commensurate with the duties of the 16 office.'
